National Reconciliation Week (NRW) and The Week of Prayer for Reconciliation are held concurrently each year between 27 May and 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey—the anniversaries of the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision.

As a church, we are committed to reconciliation with First Nations people. National Reconciliation Week and the Week of Prayer for Reconciliation give us an opportunity to put our beliefs into action.

Here are a few ideas about how you might celebrate these important 'weeks' in your church between Wednesday 27 May and Wednesday 3 June in 2020:

- Start your meetings during Reconciliation Week with an [acknowledgement of country](#) and include it during your Sunday liturgy.
- Use [prayers or intercessions](#) relevant to reconciliation and First Nations people.
- Focus your [liturgy](#) on reconciliation with First Nations people.
- Display Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander [flags](#) inside or outside your church.
- [Play videos](#) of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples speaking about reconciliation as part of your liturgy.
